iTunes	Features
Library	Music -purchased, downloaded, from CDs Movies - purchased or downloaded TV shows - purchased Podcasts - downloaded or subscriptions Radio - streaming - consumes large bandwidth
iTunes Store	Purchase music, audio books, movies, TV shows, games Download or subscribe to free Podcasts
Devices	CD's, iPods, iPhone
Playlists	Organize music or audio files
Views	List, Artwork, Cover Flow

Podcasts	Features
Audio	At the iTunes store, click Podcasts, scroll down to Featured Providers. Learnoutloud - Great Speeches in History - Martin Luther King - I have a dream - <b>Get Episode</b> . The podcast is placed in your <b>Podcasts</b> under the <b>Library</b> . <b>Subscribing</b> to a podcast - downloads the most recent episode. If you want older episodes click Get Episode. Each time you open iTunes, it checks to see if there is a new episode of the podcasts to which you are subscribed. If there is the new episode is downloaded automatically. If you no longer want to subscribe to a podcast, click unsubscribe.
Enhanced	At the iTunes store, click Podcasts, scroll down to Kids & Family >Top Podcasts > Pinky Dinky Doo: Enhanced -if it is not there.... Do a search for it.... This podcast also has downloadable
Video	At the iTunes store, click Podcasts, scroll down to Featured Providers. National Geographic - Wild Chronicles - Subscribe or Get one episode. Notice on the right at the top there is a section called <b>Listeners Also Subscribed to</b> : This is a great way to learn about other podcasts. The <b>60 Second Science</b> podcast is an audio podcast about all kinds of science topics.



Podcasts	Features
Power Search	<p>If you know a title or description of a podcast, you can use the Power Search to find it.</p> <p>From the iTunes Store Podcast front page click on the <b>Power Search</b> link under <b>Quick Links</b> on the right of the screen. Type Storynory under <b>Description</b>. Then click <b>Search</b>. This has great audio stories for young children.</p>

Exciting new content continues to be added to iTunes U. At the iTunes Store home page, click iTunes U. There are lots of universities and beyond the classroom resources.

iTunes U	Features
Lit2Go	<p>From iTunes U scroll down to the University of South Florida &gt; College of Education &gt; Lit2Go</p> <p>These are audio stories and books in the public domain read by USF professors. They are divided by grade level. Select a grade level. You may <b>Get</b> individual stories. Or you subscribe and get the most recent episode. If you select <b>Get Tracks</b> ALL the tracks will be downloaded.</p> <p>The files will be downloaded to your Podcasts organized as Lit2Go Grade level. Some may be downloaded into a Playlist, depending on how it was posted online</p>
Professional Development	<p>University of South Florida also has great professional development videos. From iTunes U scroll down to the University of South Florida &gt; College of Education &gt; Professional Development for Educators &gt; Technology in K-12 Lesson Plans &gt; select a grade level and get a movie. It will download in a Playlist.</p>
